

A SEMINARY TO THE WORLD



I'm just getting seated on a full flight headed to Tel Aviv via Newark, New Jersey. Every seat is full. I sit down next to a dignified, fiftyish African American and notice he is reading a book about prophecy.

"Are you a believer?" I asked. "Yes I am. Are you?" "Yes. Are you headed to Israel?" "No, I'm just going home." "To Newark?" "Yes, actually Wayne, NJ, about fifteen minutes from the airport." "So, what are you doing in Houston?" "I have cancer. Lymphoma. I have been trusting the Lord for about ten years, but now they say I need a bone marrow transplant. I don't know what to do." "Can I pray for you?" "I would love that. Let's wait until after take-off."

Once we leveled off, he reached over. I grabbed his hand and prayed. While I was praying, he began sobbing. He asked the flight attendant for some napkins so he could wipe away his tears. Then he said, "It's not sorrow over my situation. You see I am a pastor. I know where I am going if I die. But I have been praying that the Lord would bring me someone on this flight to encourage me. I wasn't supposed to have this seat (I had purchased an Economy Plus seat with extra leg room). I was assigned to another seat, but when they saw the wristband I am still wearing after my discharge from the hospital, they gave me this seat next to you, the only seat of this nature left. I am crying because this answer to my prayer shows me God is still with me."

We talked three of the three and a half hour flight. We talked about Position and Condition, Relationship and Fellowship. He said he had never heard of these concepts. He probably broke down another three times. Why? He had been praying for a way to finish his seminary education (he was about fifteen hours shy of a MDiv). When he heard about our school and what we believe, he

was overwhelmed. He said, "Chuck Swindoll has been my mentor at a distance. Just reading his books. Now I can study with a school that teaches what I already believe. All the seminaries I have checked out before have one professor who believes this and another who believes that. It leaves me not knowing what to believe, and I am responsible to feed my flock. So I have been praying for someone to mentor me. I want to enroll in your school today."

I said, "Well, it's Saturday, but try on Monday and we will get you going." You just never know. But that's just the point. We never know, but God does know. He knew Rema's condition, his location, his flight schedule, and his seating arrangement. With one minor adjustment, He created a divine appointment. He wanted that man to learn more about a love you can never earn and a love you can never lose, so he could pass that love on to others in his sphere of influence. If you think of it, say a prayer for him.

Say a prayer also for Grace – that God would continue to open doors to reach people like Rema.

Q & A with Grace Student Clayton Rhodes

Q: Where are you currently serving?

A: My wife and I are Marketing/Fundraising Coordinators with Child Legacy International's Clean Water Climb, a Mt. Kilimanjaro climb for clean water in Africa. Child Legacy International is a Christian non-profit organization working in Africa to transform lives through the Gospel of Jesus Christ, by providing access to clean water, proper nutrition, medical care, education and training. This ministry has taken a hold of our hearts, and we are

not only working for Child Legacy to raise awareness and funding, but we are also

raising funds as a family to bring clean water to Malawi. I also serve as a co-founder and Chairman of the Board for 45 & Hope homeless ministry in Houston, TX. 45 & Hope has over 4 years of consecutive Saturdays feeding the homeless along the Houston I-45 North corridor.

Q: What led you to pursue your education at Grace?

A: I first looked into attending Grace School of Theology based on the recommendation of my pastors and friends who had audited several classes. Before being introduced to Grace, I had all but given up on the possibility of attending seminary due to the overall cost. However, Grace offered a program I could afford and a schedule that fit my work and home life.

Q: How has Grace impacted your life and ministry?

A: Over the last four years of attending Grace, I feel that my spiritual growth and maturity have increased tremendously. Grace has helped me form a firm foundation for my current and future ministry. The greatest impact has come from the faculty. Each of the professors is not only a great teacher, but also has qualities that I can say, "When I become a pastor, I want to pastor like that."

Clayton is currently enrolled in Grace's Ministry Stewardship class and has successfully raised two times his financial goal by implementing all he has learned. The course takes a three-pronged approach toward stewardship: exploring biblical texts related to the personal use of money and possessions, learning practical skills to obtain peace in personal finance, and implementing a plan to share one's mission and vision with ministry partners for the purpose of ministerial fundraising. Growing the Grace Library

Jeremy Collier once said, "A man may as well expect to grow stronger by always eating and wiser by always reading." Books are certainly a vital part of the learning process, and therefore, libraries have long been a cornerstone of educational institutions.

Thanks to the generosity of donors and the faithfulness of a team of volunteers, Grace has been able to establish a library that can be a cornerstone of academic research for years to come.

Over the course of the last year, numerous benefactors have gifted their personal libraries to Grace. These additions, along with intentional acquisitions, have increased Grace's library to 20,000 volumes. While the growth is certainly worth celebrating, it is the "behind-the-scenes" efforts of a group of volunteers that is truly transforming Grace's library.

"Last July, we asked for volunteers. People responded, and since that time, there have been sweeping changes," says Judy Traweek, Assistant Librarian. "Our volunteers are incredibly faithful. They are willing to dust shelves, move books, alphabetize, and anything else that is needed."

With the staff and volunteers working together, the library has undergone a remarkable transformation. As of May 2013, there were only 1,980 books in the database with very few being spine-labeled. One year later, there are 7500 books catalogued with 45% spine-labeled and alphabetized.

While much has been accomplished, the library team feels their work has just begun. 


GRACE RECEIVES MATCHING GRANT:


