Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Report for Student Portion of CARES Act Funds

Grace School of Theology has signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Grace School of Theology has received \$32,732.

Grace School of Theology has awarded \$16,366 in funds to 7 students as of June 18, 2020.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 15 of our Total Student Population.

The methodology used for student selection was structured using eligibility determined by the Department of Education. This used student data from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and students who are eligible to file the FAFSA, as well as enrollment data to determine student eligibility. Eligible students must be enrolled for spring, enrolled in an on-campus program, and eligible for the FAFSA. These students were sent an electronic link to an Emergency Grant request form to be completed and returned for evaluation and awarding. Instructions and guidance were provided on the form, and in their award notification.
