


Purpose

The purpose of Institutional Effectiveness at Grace School of Theology (GRACE) is to support and implement the mission, vision, and goals through the purposeful, systematic collection of information. - 6. To grow in understanding, appreciation, and application of biblical exegesis, biblical and systematic theology, biblical interpretation, hermeneutics, history, the church, and global ministry opportunities.
- 7. To prepare students to make life long commitments and investments of their lives in Christian ministries.
- 8. To prepare students for continuing study by becoming acquainted with electronic technology resources and methods of scholarly research.
